



**This is the City of New Port Richey's permit site.**




Click Continue



Click on Select Permit by Address



Enter in address and hit submit

This is the latest roof permit pulled for the WPBOR. If you click on the permit # it will send you to a

page asking for a PIN. The only way to obtain that PIN is to call the City directly and if you're going to call you might as well ask about the date on the permit for the roof. In my experience, calling the city permitting dept. is a bit difficult. Most times I receive a voice mail saying they'll call me back and that usually takes a day


or so to happen.

A trick that I use to see when a permit was pulled is in their permit #. This one is 15-00001417. The first two digits are the year it was pulled. That, at the least, gives you an approximate age.


This is Hernando Counties permit site.

I wish I was kidding, but I have tried shortening it and it comes up with errors. It also takes a very long time to load.



You enter by just hitting CONTINUE.




Step 1: Click on LOCATION

Step 2: Enter the Street Name (you do not need to put the Street Number as the list will always be at the beginning of the street.

Step 3: Click Start Search.

You will see the list of locations appear. You need to scroll through until you find the address you're looking for.






## Pinellas County


Click in By Address, enter the Address, and you're there!

Click on Parcel Info and scroll towards the bottom of the page, just above the picture of the site.




Very simple to use!




**St Pete** is also fairly simple to navigate. Again, just set your criteria for address.



Hillsborough County can be found here and is also a simple address search. You just have to scroll down the page and pay attention.




. Tampa has its own site.
